


The City of New Haven Department of Public Works maintains the community's 231 miles of roadway surface. The department provides roadway surfaces with salt and sand, as needed, during storms. They also plow and remove snow from roadways during snow storms. During a typical Connecticut winter, 2000 tons of sand and salt are used to keep the roads safe for all drivers and pedestrians.

Although the majority of snowplowing and snow removal work is performed by Public Works, the Department also utilizes the services of local contractors to complement the town's fleet of trucks.

Snow Removal Ordinance

Sec. 27-9 Ice, Snow, Sleet—Duty of Abutting Owner to remove or abate

- (a) Removal. Any fall of snow or sleet by storm or otherwise upon any sidewalk constituting a part of any public highway, or upon any footway or sidewalk intended for the use of pedestrians, upon any bridges spanning a railroad within the limits of the city, or any ice upon said sidewalk or footway, caused by freezing or rain or both shall be removed or caused to be removed by the owner of the land, building, bridge or premises fronting upon said sidewalks or connected with a footway.
- (b) Abatement. Owner has 24 hours after snowfalls to remove the snow from sidewalk.
- (c) Penalty. Fine \$250 per day

State Roadways

The State of Connecticut DOT is responsible for all state roads in the City of New Haven.



Vacant City Lots Sidewalks

Livable Cities Initiative Department is in charge of the removal of snow on sidewalks of vacant lots owned by the City.

Crosswalks/ Handicap ramps

The Department of Public Works and Parks Department will assist as needed.

City Ordinance

16-5 - Duty of Owner, Occupants to remove violations.

It shall be the duty of every owner, occupant or tenant of any premises in said city, and of the agent of such owner, occupant or tenant, having charged of such premises, to keep free from any violation of the provisions of this chapter.

After The Storm

Potholes are created from the freezing and thawing effect under the pavement. Potholes are especially present after roads have been cleared and the temperature increases. The City will respond as quickly as possible to pothole issues.
