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PISTOL PERMIT DISOUALIFIERS

I understand that under section 29-28 if the Connecticut General Statutes (CGS), certain convictions and other events prohibit the issuance of a permit to carry pistol and revolvers. The following is a list of these convictions and other disqualifiers.

- 1. Failure to complete a course prescribed by the Commissioner of Public Safety in the Safety and Use of Pistols and Revolvers.
- 2. Felony Conviction
- 3. Misdemeanor Conviction for:
 - a. 21a-279 Illegal possession of narcotics or other controlled substances
 - b. 53a-58 Criminally negligent homicide
 - c. 53a-61 Assault in the third degree
 - d. 53a-61a Assault of a victim 60 or older in the 3rd degree
 - e. 53a-62 Threatening
 - f. 53a-63 Reckless endangerment in the first degree
 - g. 53a-96 Unlawful restraint in the second degree
 - h. 53a-175 Riot in the first degree
 - i. 53a-176 Riot in the second degree
 - j. 53a-178 Inciting to riot
 - k. 53a-181d Stalking in the second degree
- 4. Has been discharged from custody within the preceding 20 years after having been found not guilty of a crime by reason of Mental Disease or Defect pursuant to section 53a-12.
- 5. Has been confined in a hospital for mental illness as defined in section 17a-495 of the CGS, within the preceding 12 months by order of a Probate Court.
- 6. Subject to a Restraining or Protective Order issued by a Court in a case involving the use, attempted use or threatened use of physical force on another person.
- 7. Resides in the United States illegally or unlawfully.

Attention Pistol Permit Applicants

Applicants MUST be 21 years of age or older

- 1. Applications must be legibly printed using BLUE ink.
- 2. A 2x2 passport style photograph is required with a copy of your birth certificate or passport; for Naturalized Citizens, a copy of your papers; for Legal Aliens, a photocopy of your Permanent Resident Card (Green Card).
- 3. A photocopy of an official picture ID, i.e. Drivers License, with a New Haven address for proof of residency.
- 4. If applicant is applying for a Dangerous Weapon Permit, a letter from their employer stating the job in which the weapon is required.
- 5. A certificate of successful completion of a NRA course in pistol safety. The safety course must include live-firing of a firearm (no dry firing/simulated fire/simunitions). The copy of the NRA Certificate is required.
- 6. A recent fingerprint card and the State Reenrollment confirmation receipt and needed.
- 7. The application and this form must be notarized. Applicants must include a contact number where they can be reached.

Agency Privacy Requirements for Noncriminal Justice Applicants

Authorized governmental and non-governmental agencies/officials that conduct a national fingerprint-based criminal history record check on an applicant for a noncriminal justice purpose (such as employment or a license, immigration or naturalization matter, security clearance, or adoption) are obligated to ensure the applicant is provided certain notices and that the results of the check are handled in a manner that protects the applicant's privacy. All notices must be provided in writing. These obligations are pursuant to the Privacy Act of 1974, Title 5, United States Code (U.S.C.), Section 552a, and Title 28, Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Section 50.12, among other authorities.

- Officials must ensure that each applicant receives an adequate written FBI Privacy Act Statement (dated 2013 or later) when the applicant submits his/her fingerprints and associated personal information.²
- Officials must advise all applicants in writing that procedures for obtaining a change, correction, or update of an FBI criminal history record are set forth at 28 CFR 16.34. Information regarding this process may be found at https://www.edo.cjis.gov.
- Officials must provide the applicant the opportunity to complete or challenge the accuracy of the information in the FBI criminal history record.
- Officials should not deny the employment, license, or other benefit based on information in the FBI
 criminal history record until the applicant has been afforded a reasonable time to correct or complete the
 record or has declined to do so.
