In response to the opiod crises, Mayor Toni N Harp convened the Opiod Taskforce which brought forth the recommendation of public information campaign.

Withing the goal of decreasing fatal and non fatal overdoses, this signage campaign is one part of a multifaceted response. The signs will have messages of hope developed by the DMHAS LiveLoud campaign and have contact info for DMHAS 24 Call line and United Way 2-1-1.

PLANNING CONSIDERATIONS

The opiod crises affects the health, welfare and safety of New Haven residents. It has particular visibility in the public spaces of the city. The positive message campaign in the public right of way will convey compassion as well as potentially life saving public service information.
