Where do I go for a vaccination?

COVID-19 vaccines? There are small differences between the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines. Both are proven very effective during the clinical trials. Both the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines are for people 16 years old and older. Both vaccines

require two doses. The two doses of the Pfizer vaccine should be given 21 days apart. The two doses of the Moderna vaccine should be given 28 days apart.


