Meeting Minutes

- **Updates**: Commissioners discussed the following items.
 - Affordable Housing Commission Calendar & Prospective Topics
 - Commissioners included the state's housing committee meetings for February and March of 2022, evictions, foreclosures, and ARPA fundings as priority topics for the first half of the year.
 - Short term rentals (Reviewed the following states and municipalities with short term rental taxes)

- Fall 2021 Recommendations and Report
 - The Commission will present its 2021 Fall Recommendations and Report to the Board of Alders on February 1, 2022.
- Inclusionary Zoning
 - Passed by the Board of Alders with a vote of 25-1-1: 1 dissenting and 1 abstaining
 - IZ will require new and significantly rehabbed apartment buildings citywide to set aside a certain percentage of units at rents affordable to tenants earning no more than 50 percent of the area median income (AMI).
 - o IZ comes into effect after February 18, 2022.
- ARPA Funding Proposal for Phase 3
 - o Phase 3 proposes \$14 million dedicated to affordable housing
 - "The city's "I'm Home" initiatives are expected to receive a funding allocation of roughly \$10 million; included in that cost analysis is supporting a fund to provide down payment and closing cost assistance for residents to acquire or develop single-family or two-family homes."
 - o New Haven Land Bank will receive \$4 million.
 - Various housing advocates petition for subsidies and innovative housing proposals, such as direct payout to renters, housing voucher assistance, and down payment assistance.
- **3._Discussion on SCRCOG's** regional plan led by David Fink, the executive affordable housing expert.
 - Review of SCRCOG's survey process.
 - For future surveys, commissioners advised SCRCOG to use more recent demographic statistics and targeted questions that specifically reflect New Haven's housing needs.
 - a. SCRCOG and Commissioners agreed to conduct a follow-up meeting on Wednesday, February 23rd at 6:30pm.
