Proposed changes to plans approved on October 20, 2016 include:

- Reduction in extent of below-grade excavation and construction.
- Adjustments to interior floor plans. No new or expanded assembly spaces.
- Adjustments to plaza design, including elimination of sunken courtyard, reinstallation and reuse of certain site components, and replacement of existing site trees to minimize visual impact to existing conditions.
- Elimination of plan to enclose colonnade.
- Modified Grove Street elevation reflecting adjustments to north façade and roof of addition and inclusion of small mezzanine containing student study/meeting rooms within the building envelope.
- Mechanical equipment that was to be placed on the roof of the Grove Street addition will
 now be enclosed within the building, improving the pedestrian experience.
- Modified zoning table reflecting the proposed adjustments as submitted, which remain in compliance with all zoning requirements.

The proposed modifications will have no impact upon stormwater calculations and will improve the reflective heat impact calculations.
