7. YALE GOLF COURSE – seeking permits from CT DEEP, Army Corps of Engineers, and City of New Haven for major restoration project –

This project involves the restoration of the Yale Golf Course to its original design, including tees, greens, and fairway areas, and enhancing water conservation measures. No construction of buildings is proposed. Application submitted to CT DEEP is the first step in the permitting process. Permitting will also be required from the Army Corps of Engineers (ACOE).

An application for site plan/soil erosion and sediment control review will be filed with the City Plan Commission for its review after the completion of the CT DEEP and ACOE permitting processes.

The CT DEEP and Army Corps of Engineers processes are expected to be completed no earlier than spring 2023, after which the New Haven filing and meetings with community stakeholders will begin.
