From DEEP - following DEEP regulatory programs will be required: Remediation – the project proponents need to submit a Remedial Action Plan (RAP) and enter into the Voluntary Remediation Program prior to use of the Brownfield Remediation and Revitalization Program (BRRP) funding from DECD and subsequent applications for authorization from other DEEP regulatory programs. EPA is involved with review of the plans for remediation of Polychlorinated Biphenyls (PCBs) on site. Waste Engineering and Enforcement Division (WEED) solid waste permit(s) will be required. Bureau of Air Management (BAM) Air Permitting will be required to address potential emissions. Land and Water Resources Division (LWRD) wetlands permit(s) will be required. A Flood Management Certification will be required due to the use of state funds from DECD. Water Permitting and Enforcement Division (WPED) stormwater (industrial and construction) permits and wastewater permits will be required.
