



Dear Alder President Walker-Myers,

In accordance with the Order of the Board of Aldermen authorizing the Mayor to apply for and accept all grants on behalf of the City of New Haven, passed October 17, 1994, I am respectfully writing to advise you of an application by the City of New Haven's Department of Police Service to the State of Connecticut Office of Policy and Management for a \$25,000.00 grant to reimburse the department for overtime to conduct a gun violence/crime suppression program during the period February 1, 2020 through March 31, 2020. As you know, after a steady decrease in violent crime in the City for several years, this year has seen an increase. When comparing calendar years 2018 to 2019, there has been a 49.5% increase in gun violence—151 confirmed shots fired versus 101. During the same period, there was a 18.9% increase in robberies with firearms and a 56% increase in victims assaulted with a firearm. Additional beats are essential to reverse this trend.

We are also requesting consideration of unanimous consent due to the time constraints for enforcement activities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Board of Alders of the City of New Haven authorizes the Mayor of the City of New Haven to apply for funds offered by the State of Connecticut Office of Policy and Management in amount not to exceed \$25,000.00 and to accept such funds and to execute all documents and contracts as necessary.

We would like the members of the Congressional delegation to support the war powers resolution introduced by Senator Timothy M. Kaine. This Senate Joint Resolution would seek to prevent war with Iran by directing the removal of United States Armed Forces from hostilities against the Islamic Republic of Iran that have not been authorized by Congress.

In adopting this resolution, New Haven can join cities and organizations across the country in calling for restraint to avoid another costly war in the Middle East.

We urge members of the New Haven Congressional delegation to seek peace and support this resolution.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF ALDERS URGING NEW HAVEN DELEGATION TO THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO SUPPORT SENATOR TIMOTHY M. KAINE'S WAR POWERS RESOLUTION TO PREVENT WAR WITH IRAN

WHEREAS: on January 3, 2020, Iranian General Qasem Soleimani was assassinated by a military strike ordered by President Trump; and

WHEREAS: on January 7, 2020, the Iranian military responded by firing missiles at Iraq's al-Asad airbase, where United States troops are stationed; and

WHEREAS: since 2001, wars in the Middle East have diverted trillions of dollars badly needed to improve schools, strengthen infrastructure, and expand social services in American cities and across the country; and

WHEREAS: Congress has the sole power to declare war under Article I, Section 8, Clause 11 of the United States Constitution; and

WHEREAS: Congress has not yet declared war upon, nor enacted a specific statutory authorization for use of military force against, the Islamic Republic of Iran; and

WHEREAS: on January 3, 2020, United States Senator Timothy M. Kaine introduced a Senate Joint Resolution to direct the removal of United States Armed Forces from hostilities against the Islamic Republic of Iran that have not been authorized by Congress; and

WHEREAS: Congresswoman Rosa DeLauro was an original co-sponsor of and voted for the Iran War Powers Resolution passed by Congress on Thursday, January 9, 2020, and is a co-sponsor of Rep. Ro Khanna's bill, the No War Against Iran Act (H.R. 5543), which prohibits funding for an unauthorized war.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Alders hereby calls on New Haven's representatives in the United States Congress to oppose any new military ventures in Iran and to support the Senate Joint Resolution introduced by Senator Timothy M. Kaine.








Youth Stat, modeled after the police department's successful weekly Compstat gatherings brings together community leaders, heads of government agencies, Police Officers and the Board of Education to share the latest data on brewing problems with the youth and strategize how to address the issue. Entering its fifth (5th) year of partnership, Career Pathway, managed by The Justice Education Center is an intricate part of the Youth Services Departments efforts to offer vocational opportunities to young people. This endeavor is a continued effort to respond to youth violence and provide alternative avenues which will support positive decision making by at-risk and high-risk youth.

Dear Alder Walker-Myers,

I am pleased to submit to the Honorable Board of Alders ("Board") of the City of New Haven ("City") for its consideration the attached Development and Land Disposition Agreement (DLDA) and other documents representing a proposed disposal of a City-owned property at 92 Olive Street, New Haven and release of a right of reversion to a portion of 98 Olive Street, New Haven.

Over the past year, the Office of Economic Development (OED) has worked with Mr. Avi Meer, the principal of 98 Olive, LLC ("98 Olive"), on a plan to redevelop two properties at the corner of Olive and Court Streets in the Wooster Square neighborhood. He proposes to renovate 98 Olive Street, a property that he owns with an office building, into apartments, and to build on that property and 92 Olive Street a building addition with more apartments and parking. His project, when complete, will comprise approximately 31 residential units, parking, and possible retail space.

98 Olive's plan will create valuable infill development and further residential density near Downtown that will increase property values, commercial activity, and property taxes, and enhance Olive Street's existing neighborhood feel. Mr. Meer and his team have collaborated with OED and City Plan personnel on his plan's overall design, as well as the community benefits of the project:

- Compliance with the City's workforce hiring and small contractor requirements
- A Contractor Fair to inform small businesses about the project
- Construction work zone and staging plans that will require City Plan approval
- The right of private tenants who currently rent parking spaces at the property to continue to rent those parking spaces for their own use

To facilitate this project, OED proposes to sell to 98 Olive the City-owned parcel at 92 Olive Street, and to release a right that it has, under a 1986 LDA, to reclaim a portion of 98 Olive Street that it secured when it sold 98 Olive Street to 98 Olive's predecessor, Olive Court Associates. 98 Olive has agreed to pay the City, based on appraisals that OED secured of the fair value of 92 Olive Street and that right of reversion, a total of \$180,000. OED proposes to direct \$162,000 of this amount to the City's General Fund, and \$18,000 (10% of the gross transaction amount) to the City's new Affordable Housing Fund.

Mr. Meer and his team have made efforts to brief the neighborhood about the project; they appeared before the November Downtown-Wooster Square Community Management Team to inform its members on the plan, and by all accounts received favorable reviews.

I look forward to working with you and the rest of your colleagues on the Board on this request. Thank you for your time and attention to this matter.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF ALDERS OF THE CITY OF NEW HAVEN APPROVING THE DISPOSAL OF 92 OLIVE STREET, NEW HAVEN, AND APPROVING A DEVELOPMENT AND LAND DISPOSITION AGREEMENT WITH RESPECT TO 92 OLIVE STREET AND 98 OLIVE STREET, NEW HAVEN

WHEREAS, the City of New Haven (the “City”) is the owner of that parcel of land known as 92 Olive Street, New Haven, Connecticut (the “City Property”); and

WHEREAS, the City previously sold a parcel of land, known as 98 Olive Street, New Haven, Connecticut, to Olive Court Associates (“OCA”) by Quit Claim Deed, dated August 14, 1986 and recorded September 9, 1986 in volume 3526 at page 49 of the New Haven Land Records (the “Developer Property”); and

WHEREAS, the City retains a right to reclaim ownership of a portion of the Developer Property pursuant to the provisions of Section 208 of that certain prior Land Disposition Agreement between the City and OCA, dated August 14, 1986 and recorded September 9, 1986 in volume 3526 at page 55 of the New Haven Land Records (the “City’s Reversionary Interest”); and

WHEREAS, 98 Olive, LLC (the “Developer”) is the current owner of the Developer Property, and has requested that the City sell the City Property to it, and release the City’s Reversionary Interest in the Developer Property by way of a Quit Claim Deed so that the Developer may redevelop the City Property and the Developer Property into a mixed-use residential building containing approximately thirty-one (31) residential units, all as more particularly described in a Development and Land Disposition Agreement (the “DLDA”), and the City has agreed to the same; and

WHEREAS, following negotiations between the City and the Developer, and based upon independent appraisals of the City Property, the fair market value of the City Property is agreed to be One Hundred Thirty Thousand (\$130,000.00) Dollars, and the fair market value of the City’s Reversionary Interest is agreed to be Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Alders has reviewed the proposed DLDA between the City and the Developer, and finds that same is in the public interest.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED that the DLDA be approved, together with the Quit Claim Deeds described therein, and all other ancillary documentation required to implement and effect the intent and purposes set forth in the DLDA and this Order (the “Ancillary Documents”); and

FURTHER, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Mayor of the City be and hereby is authorized to execute and deliver, on behalf of the City, the DLDA in form substantially similar to that approved hereby (meaning that no “substantive amendments” may be made to same without further approval by the Board of Alders, “substantive amendments” being as defined by the Board of Aldermen by resolution adopted April 30, 2002), and to execute and deliver the Quit Claim Deeds described therein, together with all other necessary Ancillary Documents, on

behalf of the City, and the City-Town Clerk of the City be and hereby is authorized and directed to impress and attest the official seal of the City upon the DLDA, said Quit Claim Deeds, and all other Ancillary Documents, and this Order.
