The Ryan White HIV/AIDS Treatment Extension Act of 2009 and its allocation process is more fully described in the attached Executive Summary.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARYOVERVIEW OF RYAN WHITE PART A PROGRAM

Background

In 1993, New Haven and Fairfield Counties became eligible for Ryan White CARE Act. These funds were intended provide development, organization, coordination and operation of more effective and cost-efficient systems for the delivery of service. The federal government classified New Haven and Fairfield county area as one Eligible Metropolitan Area (EMA). The CARE Act required the city in the EMA with the largest number of AIDS cases to act as fiduciary or fiscal agent for these funds. Under this Act, New Haven's mayor is directly responsible for administration of Ryan White Part A funds.

The Ryan White HIV/AIDS Treatment Extension ACT of 2009 which went into effect October 30th, 2009 replaced the previous Treatment Act of 2006.

Current Funding & Services

The first year of Ryan White CARE. Act funding (FY94/95), we received approximately \$2.1 million from the federal government. Our current award for FY 2020 is \$5,420,535.00 which is \$142,386 less than FY19. Most of the award is based on the number of persons living with HIV and new cases. In the EMA the number of those living with HIV has remained stable and the cases of HIV continue to drop.

Ryan White funds are equitably distributed by the percentage of AIDS cases in proportion to the number of HIV cases reported for each sub-region in the EMA (sub-regional divisions are as follows: Region I: Greater New Haven; Region II: Waterbury; Meriden and the Naugatuck Valley; Region III: Greater Bridgeport; Region IV: Norwalk and Stamford and Region V: Greater Danbury county that make up the total of AIDS cases in this EMA.

In the current FY2020, New Haven HIV service providers received \$1,385,276 dollars to provide care, which translates to 33% of the total funds available for services for the entire EMA.

Impact

Ryan White funded services provide the vital supportive lifeline to treatments and care to those living with HIV. By the end of the last fiscal year, this grant directly assisted approximately two thousand seventy-five (2075) persons living with HIV/AIDS and their families throughout the EMA.

Communities disproportionally affected by this disease are receiving the greatest benefit of Ryan White funding. In the EMA, approximately eighty-two percent (82%) of clients served are African-American/African Descent and Latino.

Planning Council & Service Priorities

The New Haven/Fairfield Counties HIV Ryan White Planning Council consists of twenty one (21) members from throughout the EMA and is appointed by the Mayor of New Haven. The Council is mandated by Ryan White HIV Treatment Extension Act and is comprised of persons living with HIV; representatives of community based organizations and others with valuable HIV expertise. It is diverse in terms of gender, race/ethnicity and sexual orientation.

It is the Council's role to conduct needs assessments and collect other data in order to set service priorities for the approaching fiscal year and to determine the dollar amounts for each service.

This year the Council prioritized services for persons living with HIV/AIDS based on findings of needs assessments and consumer input from each of the five service regions. The assessment data provided by persons living with HIV determined the need for various services throughout the EMA. The following is the list of prioritized services for FY 2021:

- Medical Case Management
- Mental Health Services
- Outpatient/Ambulatory Health Services
- Substance Abuse Services Outpatient
- Housing Services
- Food Bank/Home Delivered Meals
- Oral Health Care
- Medical Transportation
- Substance Abuse Services Inpatient
- Emergency Financial Assistance
- Early Intervention Services
- Health Insurance Premium and Cost Sharing Assistance

Contractor Selection Process

The City of New Haven must follow guidelines, service priorities and funding allocations established by the Planning Council in accordance with the Ryan White Extension Act. The Ryan White Office follows City Purchasing rules and guidelines. It issues a Request for Proposal (RFP) for Planning Council prioritized service areas with a one year renewable option. The Bureau of Purchases advertises the RFP in local community newspapers and each major newspaper throughout New Haven and Fairfield Counties.


The RFP clearly states the services applicants might apply for, the total amount of funds available for each service area and other qualifications required by the Treatment Extension Act of 2009, the Ryan White Planning Council and the City of New Haven.

The Ryan White Office sends the proposals to individual members of a diverse review team. The goal is to select a group of individuals from throughout Connecticut who have knowledge and expertise in HIV and health services who have no conflict of interest. All reviewers are required to sign a conflict of interest statement that is kept on file.

The Ryan White office strictly adheres to the recommendations of the panel and reports the recommendations to the Mayor and Planning Council. By law, only the Planning Council has the right to change service priorities and dollar allocations that support the priorities.

Attached, please find transfer 308-21-1, transferring funds from The Office of the Assessor, Department of Recreation and Youth, Department of Parks/Public Works, and Health Department to fund the planning study for the Mayors Crisis Intervention Response Team initiative.

The City of New Haven is seeking to implement a mobile crisis intervention program, which will be integrated into the 911 dispatch as a frontline response to emergency calls. The New Haven Community Crisis Response Team aims to provide a more holistic approach to first responses by deploying staff appropriately qualified to address non-criminal crises and will be integrated into the city's social service landscape by providing direct access to a continuum of care through referral networks with city programs and non-profits. Mobile crisis intervention programs, like Crisis Assistance Helping Out On The Streets (CAHOOTS) in Eugene, Oregon, have proven to be an effective and cost-efficient solution since 1989.

The transfer allows the City to conduct a detailed planning study to examine and adjust the protocols, procedures, and policies at PSAP, PD, and FD. Additionally, the study will allow the City, gather extensive community and stakeholder feedback, build in existing services, and to adapt the program. Once additional implementation funding is secured, the program will be rolled out in phases.

WHEREAS, Article VIII, Section 3 of the City Charter and Section 2-386 (1) of the Code of General Ordinances requires the approval of the Board of Alders for the transfer of funds within the General Fund Operating Budget as adopted; and

WHEREAS, The City's Public Safety Answering Point ("PSAP") answers nearly 300,000 calls for services annually many of thousands of which are calls focused on individuals with emotional and mental health challenges, addiction challenges, and are routed to patrol officers in the New Haven Police Services Department who may not always be the best solution to the problem on the service call; and

WHEREAS, The Mayor's Office and the City's Community Services Administrator have begun an initiative to create a Community Crisis Response Team to be designed specifically to take and manage direct calls for service to those that are suffering from addiction issues and mental health crises which would normally be answered by New Haven Police Services solely; and

WHEREAS, The estimated expenditure on the planning study for Fiscal Year 2020-21 is \$100,000; and

WHEREAS, The funds for the Community Crisis Response Team planning study are available through a transfer from various City agencies; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Recreation And Youth Services, Office of The Assessor, Department of Health, And Department of Parks/Public Works are projected to lapse salary due to vacancies within each department; and,

WHEREAS, With the projected Salary surplus in each City agency listed above, \$25,000 from The Department of Recreation and Youth, \$25,000 from The Office of the Assessor, \$25,000 from the Health Department, and \$25,000 from The Department of Parks/Public Works are necessary to cover the expenditure for the creation of the Community Crisis Response Team for Fiscal Year 2020-21.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the New Haven Board of Alders that Transfer #308-21-1 be approved to transfer \$25,000 from 1-309-1010-50110, \$25,000 from 1-139-1010-50110, \$25,000 from 1-301-1010-50110, and \$25,000 from 1-504-1630-50110, in the amount of \$100,000 be transferred to 1-308-1010-56699 to cover the expenditure for the creation of the Community Crisis Response Team for Fiscal Year 2020-21

Dear Alders,

I am writing to request that the Board of Alders authorize acceptance of 2020 annual regional homeland security grant funds and to authorize the Mayor's signature on Memorandum of Agreement designating the Lower Connecticut River Valley Council of Governments (LCRVCG) as administrator of these regional funds.

Since 2007, State Homeland Security funds have been allocated to the 5 DEMHS regions within the State. The LCRVCG has been designated fiscal agent since 2009 and this is an annual MOA required by the State for participation. There has been no change in this procedure or in content of the MOA since 2009. This annual MOA has consistently been approved by the Board of Alders.

New Haven agrees to allow LCRVCG to serve as administrative agent for DEMHS Region 2 to provide financial and programmatic oversight of fiscal year 2020-2021 Homeland Security funding in the amount of \$1,654,801; such funds will be applied to specific projects developed and approved by the Regional Emergency Planning Team and implemented by LCRVCG (as identified in the MOA).

The Steering Committee approves additional shared projects by the 30 Region 2 DEMHS municipalities in the amount of \$382,156.80 for planning, maintenance, equipment and training. Not in direct funding allocations.

Since there is no direct funding to the City of New Haven and therefore no matching amounts, New Haven benefits, as do all municipalities, from regional projects that benefit everyone.



On Behalf of the Office of Emergency Management, I am submitting for your consideration and approval a resolution giving the Mayor of New Haven permission to apply for and accept the 2020 FEMA Port Security Grant. We respectfully request your honorable board's approval.

Previous Port Security Grants have allowed the City to increase security in the port, throughthe purchase of cameras, additional training for our first responders and maintenance and support of our marine vessel.

With the 2020 three-year Port Security Grant, we hope to receive federal funding of \$316,000 to continue maintenance and support for the Marine 1 Vessel as well as a maintenance contract to support and fix New Haven Port related cameras. The three-year camera contract will cover the cost of repairs, annual software upgrades, support of milestone servers, camera factory repairs and lens cleaning.

If awarded, there is a match of 25%. The City plans to utilize funds from 20/21FY CAO Capital Budget allocation of Rolling Stock as well as the General IT budget.

The total match is \$79,000. \$75,000 will be taken from IT and \$4,000 will be from CAO rolling stock.
